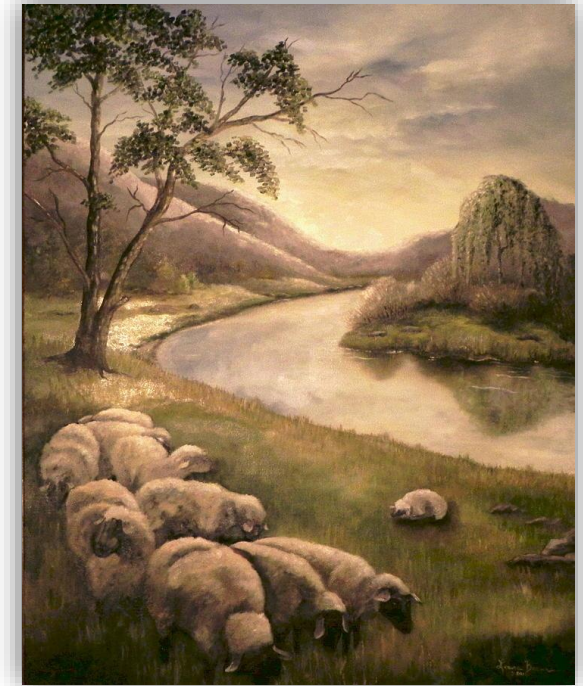

IMPORTANT NOTICE AND REQUEST ABOUT PARKING AT CHALCEDON FROM OUR HOST

- 1) Chalcedon’s driveway is a deeded access for the Tanner ranch behind us. We must allow them to get by and sometimes they bring in oversized vehicles. They do not typically do so on Sunday mornings, but if we park on both sides of the road it will be hard for anyone to get through. I suggest we **ONLY PARK ON THE OUTSIDE OF THE DRIVEWAY, AWAY FROM THE LAWN.**
- 2) The lawn has long been used as the local landing zone for the air ambulance helicopters that take patients to out-of-county trauma centers. When they land, the fire department arrives as a safety measure. Therefore, multiple fire engines/vehicles will be on scene as well as the arriving ambulance(s). These vehicles will need access; so again, if we limit our parking to the outside of the circle driveway, we ought to be able to maintain at least a single lane access.
- 3) Do not park on the dirt road that goes around the building. There is some **unpaved parking directly behind the building**. I would recommend this for trucks and SUVs, not smaller or low cars. Also, the culvert is narrow, only 10’ wide; so swing wide so you do not enter/exit at an angle.
